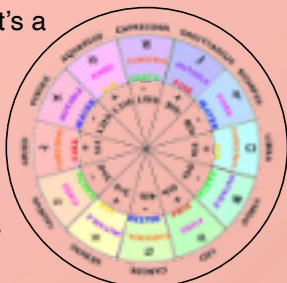
ASTROLOGY: ancient wisdom for modern life

James Drummond arrived in the 'Parmelia' in 1829 and played a key role in the development of agriculture and horticulture in the Colony. It took more than ten years for his fellow colonists to accept his observations that native poisonous plants were the cause of death of valued animal stock. Drummond became an indefatigable collector of south western plant species and seeds, making the incredible south west flora globally respected. Prior to his retirement Dr Neville Marchant was Head of the WA herbarium.

RE-IMAGINING MULAN

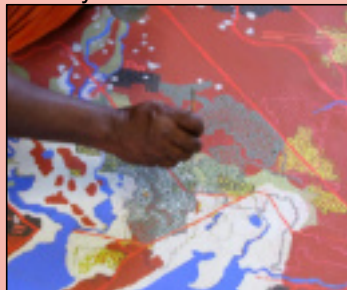

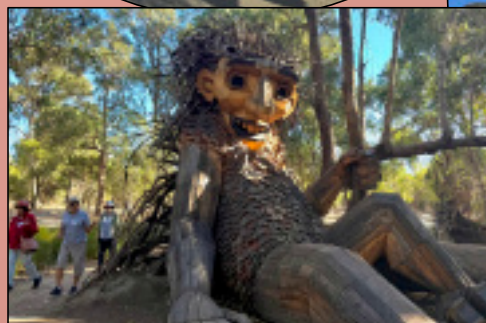

WHO WE ARE

Glyde-In Community Learning Centre has been operating since 1981. We offer courses, talks and activities that we hope will enrich members' enjoyment and knowledge, and foster a healthy community life. We aim to be a source of learning that doesn't cost the earth, that doesn't need prior knowledge or qualifications, and asks only a small commitment of time. Our courses are non-competitive and informal.

Glyde-In is a not-for-profit organisation managed by a

FEATURED ACTIVITY - OUT & ABOUT - THE GIANTS OF MANDURAH

The last of our Giants, named Seba's Song, is on a breakwater on the inlet end of the Dawsville Cut and is looking out over the water. Some of us were rewarded by the sight of a couple of dolphins who, in the absence of a boat, would get the best view of this giant.

These giants were created by a Dane named Thomas Dambo who is the subject of a very interesting TedX talk available on YouTube and are made entirely from re-cycled timber, mainly pallets
